

Courtney Crain, MD, FACOG attended medical school at Marshall University Joan C. Edwards School of Medicine, where she continued her residency training. She then continued on to Baylor College of Medicine for fellowship training in Pediatric and Adolescent Gynecology. Dr. Crain is faculty at Marshall University where she treats patients with pelvic pain, menstrual disorders, concerns with development, vulvar itching, labial adhesions, straddle injuries, contraceptive counseling and many other gynecologic issues in children and teens.



Rachel Marjorie Cullifer, MD received her medical degree at West Virginia University School of Medicine. She completed her residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology at University of Maryland Medical Center. She completed her fellowship training in Minimally Invasive Gynecologic Surgery at Christiana Care Health System in Newark, DE. She is currently Assistant Professor at WVU Physicians of Charleston, CAMC where she specializes in minimally invasive gynecology, endometriosis, pelvic pain, and infertility.



Jesse N. Cottrell, MD, MSc, FACOG attended medical school at American University of the Caribbean School of Medicine in Cupecoy, St. Maarten. He completed his residency in OBGYN at Marshall University Joan C. Edwards School of Medicine. He continued his training at University of Mississippi Medical Center where he received his fellowship in Maternal Fetal Medicine. Dr. Cottrell is faculty at Marshall University where he is fellowship trained in caring for high-risk pregnancies, including cases of preterm labor, placenta previa, miscarriage risk, multiple births, preeclampsia and gestational diabetes. He also specializes in ultrasounds, fetal echocardiograms and non-stress tests.



Omar Duenas Garcia, MD, MPH earned his medical degree from the Benemerita Universidad Autonoma de Puebla and his Doctorate of Medicine at Universidad Nacional Autonoma de Mexico.
